



Conditions of Entry

For the comfort, safety and enjoyment of all patrons, staff and event participants, the following conditions of entry apply to all BRIT attendees.

Conditions may vary for specific events – refer to the ticket information and the event pages for more information. These Conditions of Entry are to be read in conjunction with the conditions that apply to all specific events.

Patrons who do not comply with the Conditions of Entry will not be permitted entry. Patrons who have been admitted but subsequently fail to comply with the Conditions of Entry may be removed from **VENUE** without refund of any entry fee(s).

- **No Alcohol** or other drinks are permitted to be brought into the venue, as it is a breach of the Liquor Licensing Act 1997 and breaches may be subject to substantial fines to the individual. Water Bottles for personal use are exempted.
- **No Food** to be brought into the venue, this includes shared platters, take away, snacks etc.
- Patrons acknowledge that they will be exposed to **loud music**, in our performance spaces and that they should take necessary precautions for their own comfort.
- **Flashing Stage & Atmospheric Lighting** is used in our venue, please be aware that certain combinations of flashing lights can trigger seizures for anyone with photo-sensitive epilepsy. We use a variety of effects, which could include; Fast Strobing Lights, Multiple Strobes and Flashing Lights, Laser lights etc. Patrons are advised to take necessary precautions for their own safety and comfort.
- **Dancing** is a physical activity, Patrons understand that there are risks of physical injury associated with, arising out of, and inherent to dancing. These risks include the potential for slips and falls, sprains, strains, dislocations, soft tissue injuries, musculoskeletal injuries, podiatric conditions, and other risks not specified here. Patrons understanding these risks and the potential for others not listed, agree to personally accept and assume all of the risks present in their participation. The BRIT accepts no liability for any damage or injury caused by the activity.
